Once again we are in the season of Lent. Many of us remember Lent as a time for fasting, abstinence, way of the cross, alms giving and penance. Many too consider the Lenten campaign as a means of raising funds for the



poor. We become very generous during this season and donate graciously towards this fund. These may nevertheless be some of the ways of observing Lent but there is much more to Lent than just donating generously for the poor and denying ourselves of some pleasures in life.

Goodness, sacrifice and charity should not be just confined to Lent but rather Lent should be the beginning of a new commitment to share what we have with fellow men. It need not be money or wealth but our time, energy, talents, skills and above all our love with those we come into contact daily especially the poor.

Who are the poor? Traditionally the poor refers to those

financially deprived without food, clothing and shelter but in our country although there are still such hard core poor in our midst who need such aid but more often we encounter other forms of poverty particularly in urban areas. To certain extent everyone around us is "poor" in some way or other as they are silently suffering from some form of ailment either physical or mental; serious illness, loneliness, loss of loved ones, financial problems, failures in career, and the list is in fact endless.

All it takes is for us to open our eyes and ears to realize their cries and offer our hands of friendship that could help to alleviate their suffering. We may not be in a position to totally eradicate their "poverty", only God can do that, but I am sure we can do the little within our means to reduce their pain and agony.

This Lent let us recall the words of Jesus "I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mathew 25:40). It should be a reminder to us that Jesus dwells in those around us, especially the needy, oppressed and the despised. We will only be cheating ourselves if we say we love Jesus while refusing to lend a hand to those around us.

We can sacrifice some precious possessions of ours - our time, energy and wealth for the betterment of fellow mankind. At the same we can give up something which we all possess in abundance - pride, selfishness, ego, anger and greed which impede our endeavors to serve others.

The real meaning of Lent is sacrifice, not for our well-being but that of others. Fasting, abstinence and prayer are just a means to achieve that goal not the goals themselves. We are asked to become holy but our holiness in God must benefit others more than ourselves.

Let's make this season of Lent the beginning of being more aware of the needs of those around us, especially those who are suffering in loneliness. Let's lend a hand to someone who is lonely and at the brink of death. Let's start with those lonely in our own families especially our

CHURCH – Holy Week is approaching. There will be opportunities for us to spiritually walk with Christ as He is received with shouts of "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" ... as He institutes the Eucharist and the priesthood ... the opportunity to stay and pray or to fall asleep in His darkest hour. We will have the opportunity to walk with Him as He is betrayed, deserted, beaten, illegally tried, condemned, inhumanely tortured, spit upon, and ridiculed. We will have the opportunity to walk with Him as He carries the cross, falls under the weight of the cross, perhaps even crawls under the weight of the cross, already so near death that Simon is forcibly pressed into service to help Him. We will have the opportunity to witness Him take our sins upon Himself so that the chains of sin can be broken...Adam and Eve ate of the tree of life thus bringing death into the world. Now Jesus, the Lamb of God, hangs on the tree of death bringing everlasting life into the world. We will have the opportunity to be present as our Lord gives us to His

mother and as He gives his mother to us. We will have the opportunity to be there as He gives up His Spirit, dies for us, and is laid in the tomb.

As we prepare for Holy Week, I would invite you to reflect on some of those who were there then. How do we, today, identify with them? How are we like them?

Are we sometimes like ...

The Pharisees – Knowledgeable of religion, its practices and traditions, but unable to see that God is in our midst...so busy with what we think is important that we are deaf to what Jesus is telling us is really important.

Peter – When we allow fear to overwhelm us. When we are afraid to stand up for what is right and true. When we are afraid to proclaim or even acknowledge our Faith. When, although we have walked with Jesus, touched Him, spoken with Him, seen the wonders He has done ... right in front of us, run away at the most critical of times.

The crowd – When we close God out and listen to others and allow them to influence us to accuse others wrongly or to shout for blood.

Herod – Reducing Jesus to some small wonder-worker or looking for some magical sign.

Pilate – When we give in to the crowd telling us what to do, pressuring us to do something ... even when we know it isn't right. Or when we are so caught up in ourselves and our own worries that we attempt to create our own truth or deny there is such a thing as truth ... even when THE TRUTH, Christ is there before us.

The soldiers – When we continue to sin, although our sins tear at, bruise, scourge, and pierce our Lord...all while He is pleading for us, "Father, forgive them." Here, the word He uses is ABBA, a word that was really used by young children when addressing their fathers. A word that may be better translated as "Daddy." "Daddy", forgive them.

The scoffing criminal crucified next to Jesus – When we allow ourselves to become so angry and bitter that we are actually angry and bitter with God.

Perhaps we are like some of these people. Perhaps we are like all of these people. One thing is for sure though. We are, each and every one of us, like:

Barrabas – the notorious sinner who truly deserved to

die, and in fact had already been condemned to death ... but instead, Jesus, our God who humbled Himself and became one of us, took our place on the cross and died for us so that we might live.

Yes, we will have many opportunities during Holy Week. The question is, will we make the most of those opportunities? How will we approach Holy Week and all that our Lord is offering to us in its meaning? May we be his companions all the way to the tomb, and may we rise with Him on Easter morn.

Most Reverend Kevin Farrell, Bishop of Dallas (a Third Degree Knight of Columbus) held the First Ever Diocesan Corporate Communion at the Cathedral Shrine of the Virgin of Guadalupe in Dallas, TX on March 7, 2009. The Corporate Communion was a tremendous success, highlighted by Bishop Farrell being the Major Celebrant, accompanied by eight other priests and three deacons.

Each procession was beautiful, with forty-two members of the Dallas Area Knights of Columbus Color Guard leading the way. The event was attended by, what appeared to be, every State Officer, Dallas Area District Deputy, and Dallas Area Grand Knight. Many of the Councils brought their respective Council Banners to show support for and help beautify the event. We had a total of 22 people that represented our council.

Bishop Farrell spoke eloquently and extremely complimentarily about the Knights of Columbus, the works of the Knights, and the importance of the Knights to the Catholic Church. He gave a great homily that thanked the Knights for all our support. The Bishop has asked the rhetorical question "...Where would the Catholic Church in the United States be without the Knights of Columbus?" and has stated that it was "... good to have his protectors, the Knights of Columbus..." around him at various functions.

Mr. Ron Gay, Supreme Deputy, followed with his usual effectiveness, seemingly causing a burst of enthusiasm in each person in the Cathedral. Mr. Gay spoke of the successes Texas has recently enjoyed in the Knights of Columbus, and said he expects us to surpass New York as the top producer in Star Council Areas of the Knights for the current fiscal year.

Due to the success of the first one, Bishop Farrell promised to make the Diocesan Corporate Communion

an annual affair for as long as he is our shepherd. The date for 2010 has already been set for March 27 to coincide as closely as possible with Founder's Day (March 29). We hope to make Council 12480 the best-represented Council in the State at the 2010 Diocesan Corporate Communion. We have a whole year to prepare for it, so please put it on your calendar and make it your top priority..

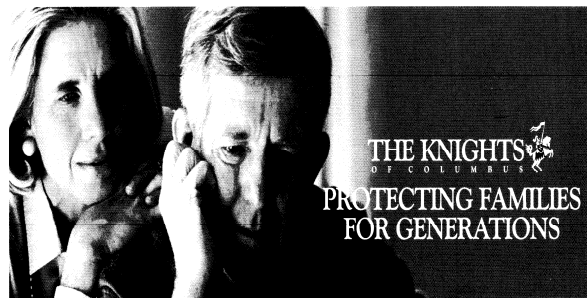
